

## Four Parts

LOGOS strives to build Christian relationships in a four-part retreat experience every week, following the example of the early church:



**Bible Study** - What is learned in Bible study is practiced in the other three parts.

**Worship Skills** - Learning and training for participation and leadership in worship. Relationships are rooted in worship.

**Recreation** - Athletics, games, hobbies and crafts - recreational activities of all kinds. A time to build relationships through shared interests and fun with many peers and adults in the congregation.

**Family Time** - Dinner hour and table games with "family groups" composed of children or youth at each table with adults serving as table parents. A celebration of relationships over a shared meal.

## What about....?

### Guests/Visitors

Visitors are welcome and we encourage youth and children to bring their friends to visit LOGOS. A reservation is important to help us prepare a place for each guest at the table. A guest/visitor may attend three times for the cost of the meal. At that time, parents will be contacted with information and invited to register their child or youth in the program.



### Transportation

Individual arrangement of carpools is encouraged, if you are unable to work out transportation to or from LOGOS, please speak with one of the co-directors and they will try to work out the arrangements.

Remember that all elementary children need to be picked-up by 7:30 p.m. Calls will be made to parents for any children not picked-up within 15 minutes.

### Childcare

Childcare will be available for children too young to participate in LOGOS on the evenings when their parents are fulfilling their commitment to serve in the ministry. Children age 3-5 may participate in our pre-school ministry, LOGITOS. Children under three will be cared for by our nursery staff. Children who are present through dinner will be served for the cost of the meal.

# What is LOGOS?

LOGOS is a Wednesday night ministry of Christian nurture for children and youth (grades K - 12) and the whole church. It is a structured "retreat every week," providing all the dynamics of a good camp/conference program, but experienced in the context of congregational life. It promotes the growth of inter-generational relationships which bond the entire congregation into an authentic community of faith.



## Why LOGOS?

Nurturing people, especially youth and children, into right relationships of faith with God through Jesus Christ is the most important thing the church ever does.

Youth and children today experience many unique

stresses and pressures, unknown to previous generations. We must provide an environment where a strong relationship with Jesus Christ can be established. That relationship equips children and youth to resist the pressures of society.

It is our responsibility as Christ's church to provide a place for our young people to grow spiritually. We have only a short time with them on Sunday morning and/or evening. The LOGOS ministry on Wednesday builds a bridge between Sundays. LOGOS provides an arena where what is learned on Sunday and Wednesday can be put into practice as we strengthen relationships with one another and with God.

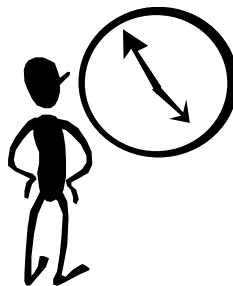

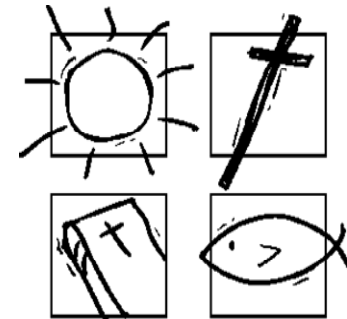

## Parental Expectations

Parents are to:

- Attend the registration session or speak with a LOGOS Leadership Team member.
- Make it possible for their child/youth to attend LOGOS, Sunday School and worship
- Encourage and participate in daily Bible reading and prayer.
- Give willing participation in service to LOGOS (weekly or occasionally). Among the many opportunities are — leading a group, cooking, scrapbooking, decorating, or taking the kitchen linens home to launder.
- Arrange for prompt payment of fees.
- Arrange for prompt "pick-up" following LOGOS.
